

## **FACILITIES**

### **How many students share a room?**

While space permits, we will be able to provide 2 students per bedroom, or 4 students to an apartment. At most, there would be (if the need arises) 3 students per bedroom.

### **Can I have a private room?**

Single rooms are available on a waiting list request. If a student desires to add their name to this list, they may do so at anytime during the course of the year. The cost is an additional \$750 per semester. Priority is given to Seniors and upperclassmen based on number of credit hours accrued. To add your name to the single room waiting list, simply contact the Director of Housing.

### **Do the rooms have private or community bathrooms?**

Each of the apartment bedrooms has their own private bathroom.

### **Are the apartments air-conditioned?**

Yes. The Residential Life Department/Staff suggests that the temperature should be preset at a reasonable level between 72 and 80 degrees.

### **Are the residence halls co-ed?**

Our facilities are arranged such that males and females do not live in the same apartment suite. They do, however, live in close proximity to one another such that it is possible the apartment next door could be that of the opposite sex.

### **Do I have to clean my own bathroom?**

Yes! No housekeeping services are provided for individual rooms/bathrooms; therefore it is the responsibility of the residents of the living space to clean regularly. There will be announced Health and Safety inspections once every 5-6 weeks into the semester to ensure compliance of this takes place. If a resident fails the inspection, they will be given 24 hours to ensure that it meets the expectations of the Residential Life Staff. Failure to do so will result in a charge for a professional cleaning service to come out and sanitize the space.

### **What furniture is provided in my room?**

On average, each bedroom has 3 beds, 3 closets, a dresser, and 3 mattresses (XL Twin). The living room comes furnished with 1 sofa, 1 loveseat chair, 2 end tables, a lamp, and 1 coffee table.

**May I bring my own furniture?**

The Residential Life Staff would like to support your being able to feel at home and comfortable while you are staying here on the Florida Campus. As such, we will permit you to bring in your own furniture, however, we must caution you to not put more into the space than what would be safe. You have to allow for easy points of entry and egress in the event of an emergency. Please note that we do provide a couch, at least 2 end tables, 1 loveseat chair, a coffee table, at least 2 desk chairs per study room and lamps as the basic furnishings already staple to the living space within each suite.

**What are the dimensions of the living space?**

**Are there computer, cable and/or phone connections in my room?**

Each residence hall apartment has wireless connectivity to the internet. In the event a resident desires a high speed internet connection there are 3 jacks/ports directly connected to Northwood's network within their study room space.

**Is there telephone access?**

Because we like to allow students to make local calls or receive phone calls from family members/friends, we do provide basic local phone service to each apartment suite. Students are responsible for using a calling card to place calls outside of the local calling area. We do not permit collect calls to take place.

**Is there cable television?**

Northwood University provides basic cable services with over 70 channels. Residents if they so desire may purchase additional packages from the cable provider (Comcast) by visiting their store location directly or contacting the company via phone or internet.

**Are utilities included in the cost of housing?**

Yes. The University as part of the student's rent covers the cost of electricity, water/sewer, and rubble collection.
