Naegele Distinguished Community Service Award

The Robert and Patricia Naegele Distinguished Community Service Award was started in 2005, and the first recipients of the award were the Naegeles themselves. At that time, Robert had already passed, but Patricia had committed significant funding to the University to renovate what is now known as Naegele Village and to build the new Naegele Drive roadway.

Robert and Patricia became involved with Northwood through their church and began housing NU students from South America. Pat was also a charter member of Town and Campus, and became head of the National Women's Board in 1993. Pat and Robert served on Northwood University's Board of Trustees, and Pat was granted an honorary doctorate in 1996.

The Naegele Distinguished Community Service Award was created as a way to honor the Naegele's significant commitment, and support to Northwood University and its students. Since its inception, the award has recognized individuals from the Midland area who have significantly impacted the local community in a positive way through their volunteer, philanthropic, and advocacy efforts.

Bobbie and David Arnold live in Midland, Michigan and are involved in their community in many ways. Bobbie was the President and CEO of the Charles J. Strosacker Foundation for 18 years. She has been serving as a trustee and officer since 2001. David also serves as a trustee. While serving as President of the Foundation, Bobbie oversaw the granting of more than 50M in eighteen years. David's career took them across the country at various coaching stops. His coaching career spanned six decades ranging from Pop Warner and collegiate programs to the NFL. In 1984 he led Montana State University to the IAA National Championship, he had two national championships at the University of Miami as well as many league and state championships. He coached seven NFL Hall of Famers and a Heisman trophy winner. He finished his career at Northwood University, volunteering for twelve years working alongside his son E.J., who is currently Associate Head Coach and Special Teams Coordinator.

Their three children and their families live in Midland.

Lead Marshal

Dr. Stacey Tetloff is the associate academic dean of Northwood University's undergraduate programs and teaches courses in Northwood's Professional and Technical Communications program.

Stacey earned a Master of Professional Writing from Chatham University and a Ph.D. in leadership with a specialization in reading, language, and literacy from Concordia University Chicago. Her dissertation research explored industry expert adjunct faculty perspectives on writing-in-the-disciplines.

Stacey was drawn to Northwood's mission, values, and code of ethics, and she began teaching at Northwood University in 2011 as an adjunct faculty member. She joined Northwood's undergraduate academic administration in 2017. Outside of academia, her professional career has included positions as a technical writer, journalist, editor, marketing communications specialist, and editorial project manager.

While her role at Northwood offers many rewarding opportunities to engage with faculty and students, Stacey is most passionate about supporting students, in and out of the classroom, on their journeys to become free-enterprise leaders.

Significance of the Mace

The mace, carried proudly at the head of our academic procession, is emblematic of the ethics and ideals for which Northwood University stands.

The mace is made of brass for strength and silvered for beauty. The three interlocking pieces total a little over three feet in length and each of the three pieces represents a Northwood University idea. At the top is the flame of learning.

The bottom section is emblematic of the strength of Northwood University's base, co-founders Arthur E. Turner and R. Gary Stauffer. Their names are engraved here as is the founding date.

The two insignia are an acorn and an oak leaf. The acorn symbolizes one of our greatest strengths and richest resources—our young people. The oak leaf implies that the acorn's value is in the tree that grows straight and a fundamental purpose of the Northwood Idea is the productive development of that latent strength.

The middle section stands for our country, with a sheaf of wheat—the rich promise of our land; and the American flag—the emblem of our country's free enterprise principle which turns rich potential into vital yield.

The top section has a plant with blossoms and a cross with the crown and its promise.

When not leading the academic procession, the three tiers can be separated and placed in a walnut base—each tier is designed to hold the flag it symbolizes.

The Northwood mace was designed and donated to the college in its earliest days by Dr. and Mrs. C. W. Whitston of California.

Significance of Academic Regalia

The significance of academic regalia is determined especially by the sleeves and hoods.

Doctors wear the round bell sleeves; the gown is faced down the front and barred on the sleeves with black velvet or color indicating the degree; the doctor's hood is large. The doctor may, if he or she so chooses, wear the gold tassel on his or her cap.

Masters wear the long, closed sleeve, with a slit near the upper part of the arm; the master's hood is of more moderate size.

Bachelors and associates wear the long or pointed sleeve.

Hoods are lined with the colors of the institutions granting the degree, or with which the wearer is connected, and are trimmed with velvet of the color distinctive of the degree—for example, humanities and social science, white; philosophy, blue; science, golden yellow; music, pink; engineering, orange; education, light blue; business and public management, drab; laws, purple.

The Flags on Display

The 96 colorful flags displayed on campus represent the countries of Northwood students, both past and present, who have been enrolled on the Michigan Campus since 1990. The students have contributed to an international atmosphere and an opportunity for close personal relationships which lead to special international understanding.
